JUDGMENT

Judgment in this matter is entered in accordance with the Order Granting Motion for Final Approval of Class Action and PAGA Settlement. With the exception of Madaly Alcala and Connie E. Kautzman, who opted out of the Settlement Class, this Judgment shall be binding on all members of the Settlement Class: All persons who worked for Defendant as non-exempt, hourly employees in California at any time from October 10, 2018 through September 17, 2021 ("Participating Class Members").

Five percent of Class Counsel's fee award, or \$23,000, is to be kept in an interest-bearing account established by the Settlement Administrator until the completion of the distribution process and Court approval of a final accounting. Plaintiffs shall file and serve a report/declaration summarizing all distributions made pursuant to the approved Settlement on or before January 12, 2023. The Court sets an OSC re Compliance with the terms of the Settlement for January 19, 2023 at 9:00 a.m.

Without affecting the finality of the Judgment, the Court shall retain exclusive and continuing jurisdiction over the above-captioned action and the parties, including all Participating Class Members, for purposes of enforcing the terms of the Judgment entered herein. This document shall constitute a judgment (and separate document constituting said judgment) for purposes of California Rules of Court, Rule 3.769(h).
