KASHANIAN filed the Class Action Complaint on behalf of himself and all 23 24 persons similarly situated, seeking statutory damages for Defendant, NATIONAL ENTERPRISE 25 SYSTEMS, INC.'s, alleged violations of the California Rosenthal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act, 26 California Civil Code §§ 1788-1788.33. 27 3. After briefing and a hearing, on May 4, 2023, the Court entered its Order on Motion 28

of Plaintiff for Class Certification, wherein the Court certified the case as a Class Action, appointed KASHANIAN as Class Representative, and appointed Fred W. Schwinn, Raeon R. Roulston, and Matthew C. Salmonsen of Consumer Law Center, Inc., as Class Counsel.

- Pursuant to the Court's Order on Motion of Plaintiff for Class Certification, the 4. parties, by and through their respective counsel, hereby stipulate and agree, for the sole purposes of this action only, as follows:
- The Class Administrator shall be CPT Group, Inc., 50 Corporate Park, Irvine, CA 92606.
- Defendant represents that the class list previously produced in discovery is complete and up-to-date, and appropriate for use for Class notice.
- The Class Administrator shall promptly provide notice to the Class in the form of Exhibits "A," "B," and "C," attached hereto.
 - KASHANIAN and Class Counsel have engaged the Class Administrator to implement a robust system of notice to the approximately 40,239 Class members, consisting of a postcard delivered by the United States Postal Service (Exhibit "A"), which directs Class members to a static website for more detailed information (Exhibit "B"), as well as a telephone hotline (See Exhibit "C") for those Class members who may be unable to access the website.
- Class Members shall have 60 days from the date of mailing of the notice to exclude themselves from the certified class.



1. Why Should I Read this Notice?

The Complaint in this litigation has been certified to proceed as a class action in the Santa Clara County Superior Court, entitled *Kashanian v. National Enterprise Systems*, *Inc.*, Case No. CV416920 ("Lawsuit"). You have been identified as a member of the Class. This Notice explains the nature of the Lawsuit and informs you of your legal rights and obligations. You should read this Notice to learn what this Lawsuit is about and what you need to do if you wish to exclude yourself as a class member or to enter an appearance through your own attorney.

2. What is this Lawsuit About?

Jimmy Kashanian ("Plaintiff") filed this Lawsuit against National Enterprise Systems, Inc. ("Defendant"), alleging that Defendant sent a first written communication to Plaintiff and other Class Members in an attempt to collect a defaulted consumer debt (Exhibit "1") which fails to provide the notice required by California Civil Code § 1812.700(a) in the manner required by California Civil Code § 1812.701(b). Defendant denies that it violated California Civil Code § 1812.701(b) in any manner, and has asserted other defenses in this matter.

3. Why is this a Class Action?

Believing that others also received a notice similar to the notice that he received from Defendant, Plaintiff filed the Lawsuit as a class action. A class action is a type of lawsuit in which one or a few individuals represent a group of people who were allegedly harmed by a defendant's conduct. This group of people is referred to as the "Class" or as the "Class Members."

4. Who is a Class Member for this Lawsuit?

You have been identified as a Class Member in this Lawsuit. The Class is defined as:

All persons with addresses in California to whom Defendant sent, or caused to be sent, an initial written communication in the form of Exhibit "1" to the <u>First Amended Class Action Complaint for Statutory Damages</u> in an attempt to collect a defaulted consumer debt originally owed to BANK OF AMERICA, N.A., which were not returned as undeliverable by the U.S. Post Office during the period December 27, 2015, through May 4, 2023.

Excluded from the class are any officers, directors, or legal representatives of National Enterprise Systems, Inc., and any judge, justice, or judicial officer presiding over this matter and the members of their immediate families and judicial staff.

5. How Do I Enter My Appearance in this Lawsuit?

Entering an appearance is <u>NOT</u> necessary to participate in this lawsuit. Class Counsel will represent the Class without charge to you or the other Class Members. However, if you wish to do so, you may be represented by your own attorney in this Lawsuit at your own expense.

6. If I Do Not Want to be in the Class, How Do I Exclude Myself?

If you do NOT want to remain a Class Member and wish to exclude yourself from the Lawsuit, you must send a written request to the Class Administrator listed below. The request must be in writing and include the name and number of this case (Jimmy Kashanian v. National Enterprise Systems, Inc., et al, Case No. CV416920), your name, address, telephone number, and must be dated and signed by you as the Class Member. Plaintiff, Jimmy Kashanian, has been appointed by the Court as the Class Representative. The Court has also approved Plaintiff's attorneys below to represent the Class. 8. How Will My Claims Be Affected If I Am A Member of The Class?
