The Court grants Preliminary Approval of the Joint Stipulation and Settlement 25 Agreement, as modified by the Stipulation to Amend Joint Stipulation and Class Settlement 26 Agreement, as amended by the Stipulation to Amend Joint Stipulation and Class Settlement 27 Agreement (the "Settlement Agreement"), and conditionally certifies the Class, defined as "all

Defendant in the State of California at any time between October 26, 2017 and the date of preliminary approval of this Settlement for settlement purposes only, based upon the facts set forth in the Settlement Agreement attached as Exhibit A to the Declaration of James Farinaro, as amended by the Stipulation to Amend Joint Stipulation and Class Settlement Agreement.

- 2. This Order incorporates by reference the definitions contained in the Settlement Agreement. The Settlement appears to be fair, adequate, and reasonable.
- 3. The Settlement falls within the range of reasonableness and appears to be presumptively valid, subject only to any objections that may be raised at the final fairness hearing and final approval by this Court.
- 4. A final fairness hearing on the question of whether the proposed Settlement, Class Counsel's Fees and Costs, and each of the Class Representative's Enhancement should be finally approved as fair, reasonable and adequate to the members of the Settlement Class is scheduled for November 24, 2020, at 3:00 pm, in Department 23 of the Alameda County Superior Court, Administration Building, 1221 Oak Street, Oakland, California 94612.
- 5. The Court approves, as to form and content, the proposed Notice of Pendency of Class Action and Proposed Settlement, attached as Exhibit A hereto (the "Notice"). The Court approves the procedure for Class Members to object to the Settlement and/or opt-out of the Settlement as set forth in the Notice.
- 6. The Court directs the mailing of the Notice by First-Class Mail to the Class Members in accordance with the schedule set forth below. The Court finds that the dates selected for the mailing and distribution of the Notice, as set forth in the schedule, meet the requirements of due process and provide the best notice practicable under the circumstances and shall constitute due and sufficient notice to all persons entitled thereto.
- 7. The Court finds that the Class, as defined in the Settlement Agreement, for settlement purposes only, meets the requirements for class certification in that: (a) the Class is sufficiently numerous and ascertainable; (b) the Class meets the commonality requirement as common questions of fact and law predominate; (c) the claims of the Class Representative are typical of those of the Class; (d) the Class Representative and Plaintiffs' Counsel have and are
